

## CALL FOR NOMINATIONS: THE HOLBERG PRIZE 2018

The Holberg Prize is an international research prize awarded to scholars who have made outstanding contributions to research in the arts and humanities, social sciences, law or theology. The prize money amounts to NOK 4.5 million (EUR 490.000 / USD 525.000\*). The Holberg Prize was established by the Norwegian Government in 2003 and is awarded annually.

How to nominate?

Scholars holding a position at universities or other research institutions are entitled to nominate candidates for the Holberg Prize.

The Holberg Committee will base its assessment on the letters of nomination (1 page maximum), which must state the reasons for the nomination. Nominations should also contain a brief CV for the candidate and suggestions for referees who know the scholar's work. Joint nominations will not carry extra weight. Nominations are strictly confidential. The 2018 Holberg Prize Laureate will be announced in March 2018.
